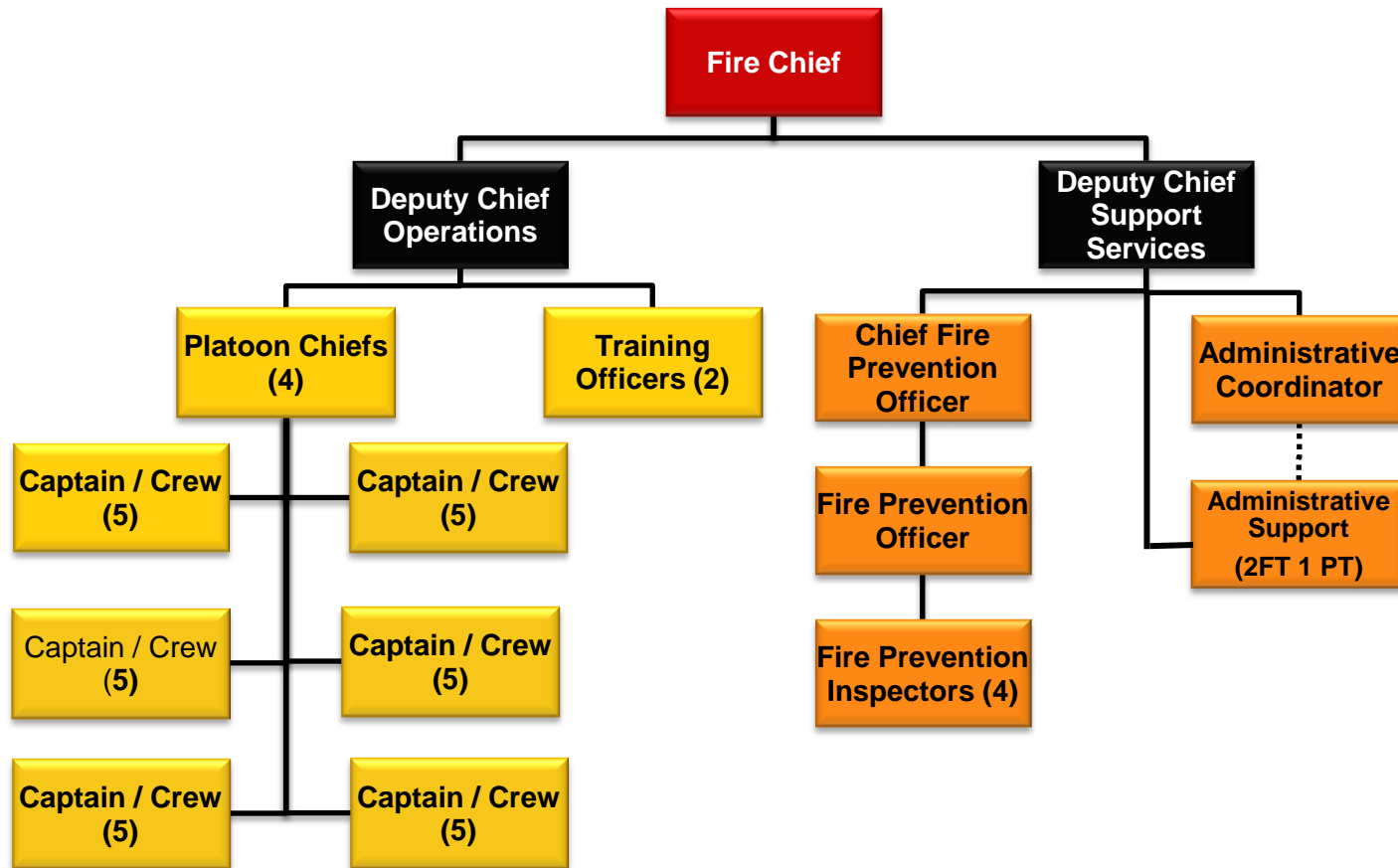
# MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

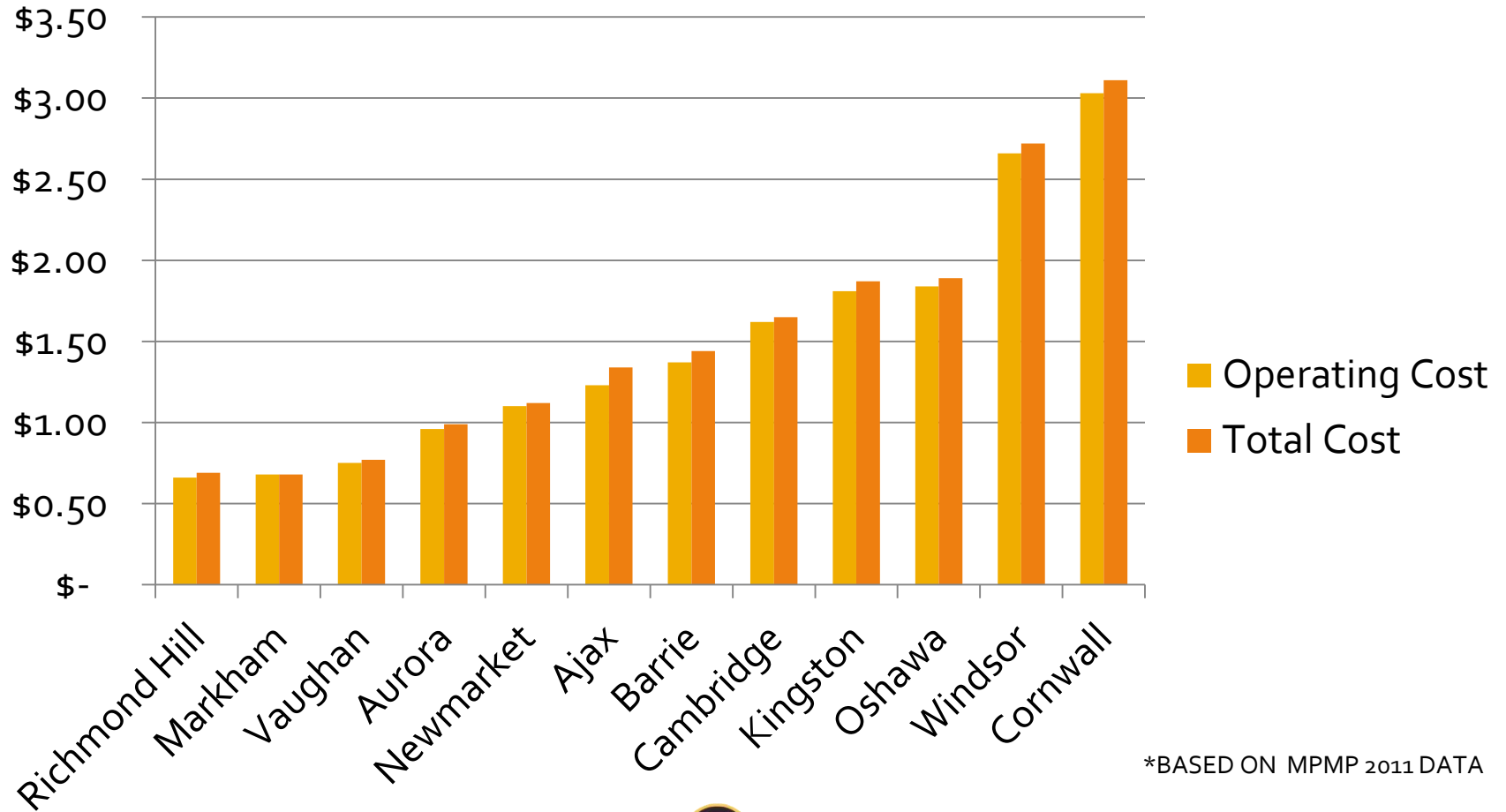

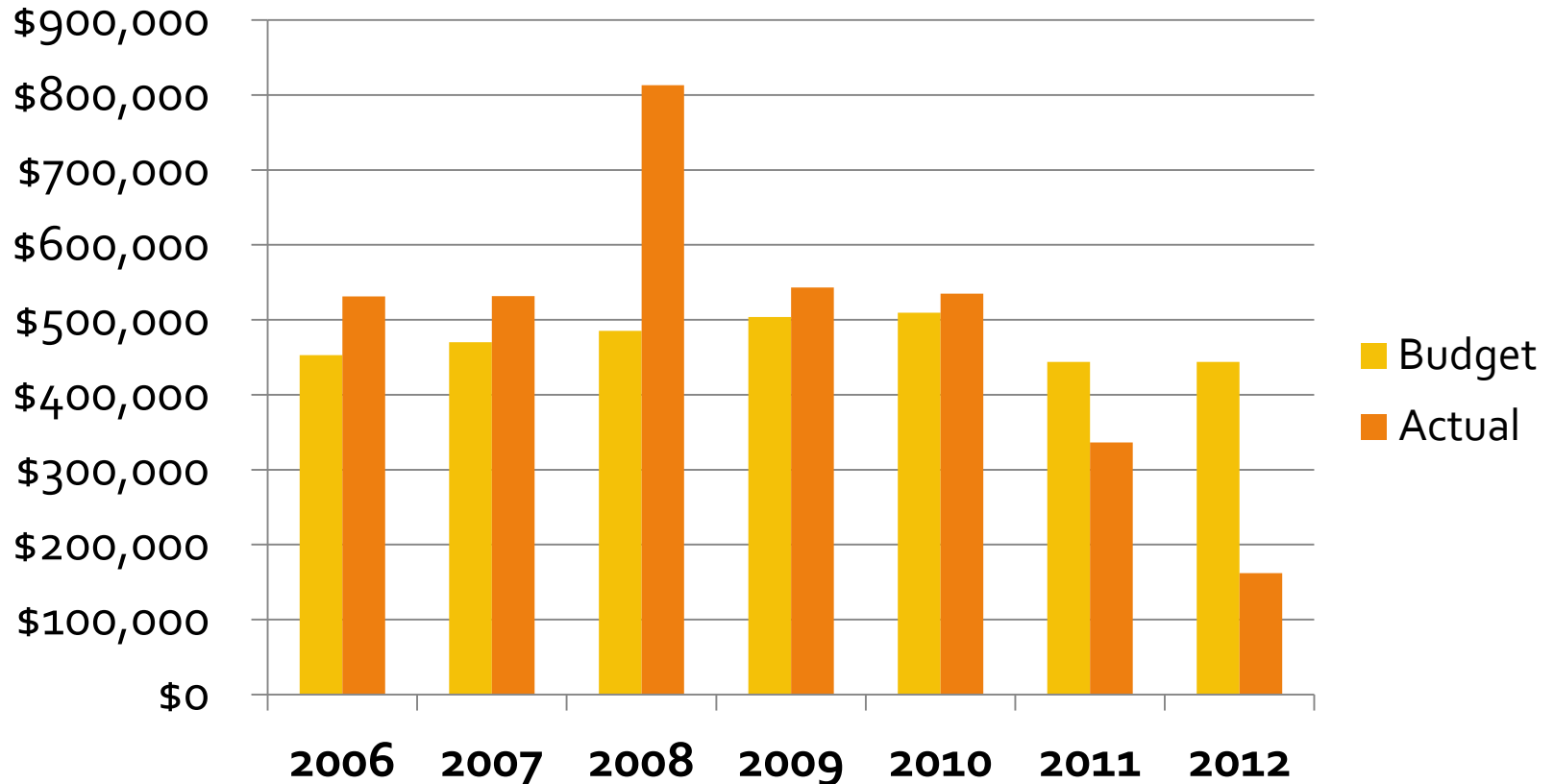
# FIRE SERVICE COST



\*BASED ON MPMP 2011 DATA

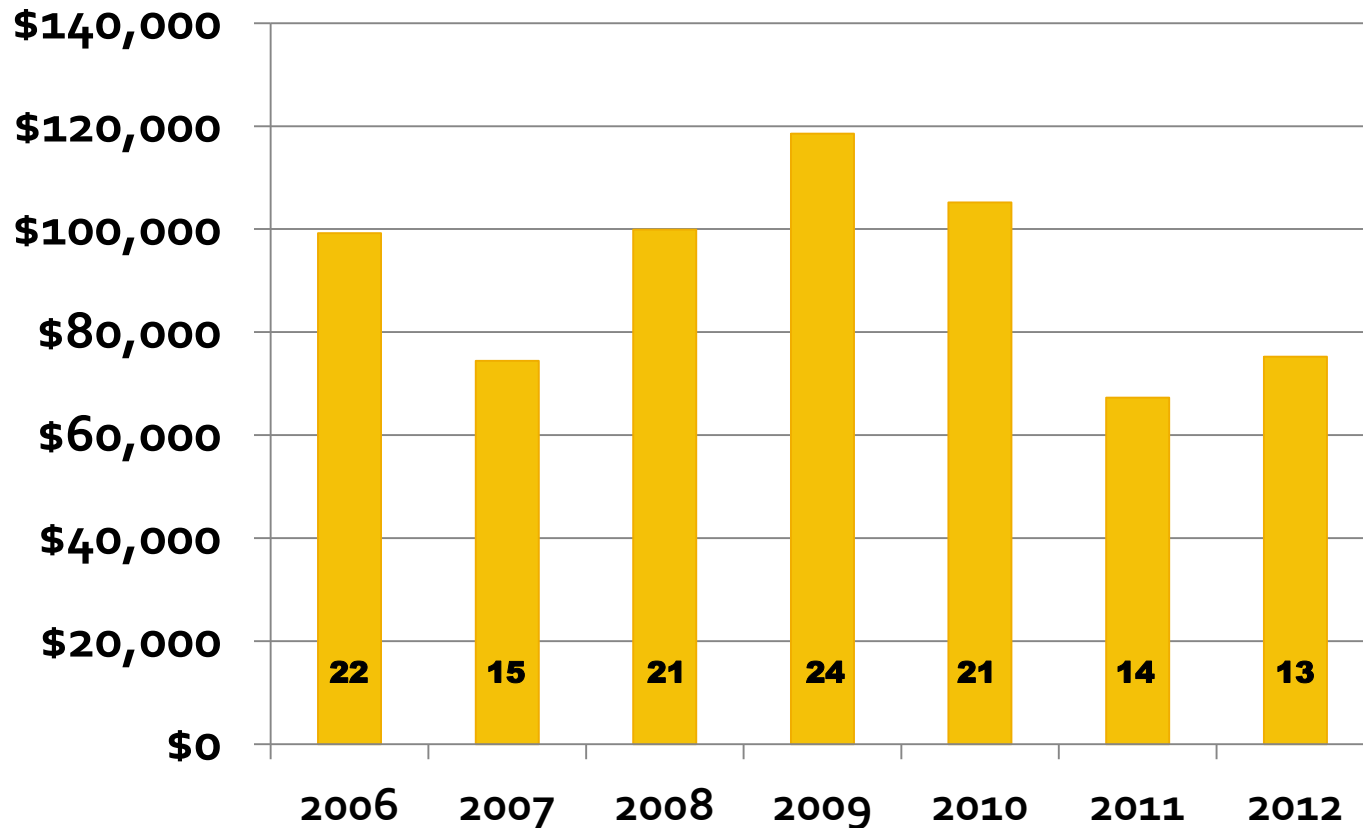

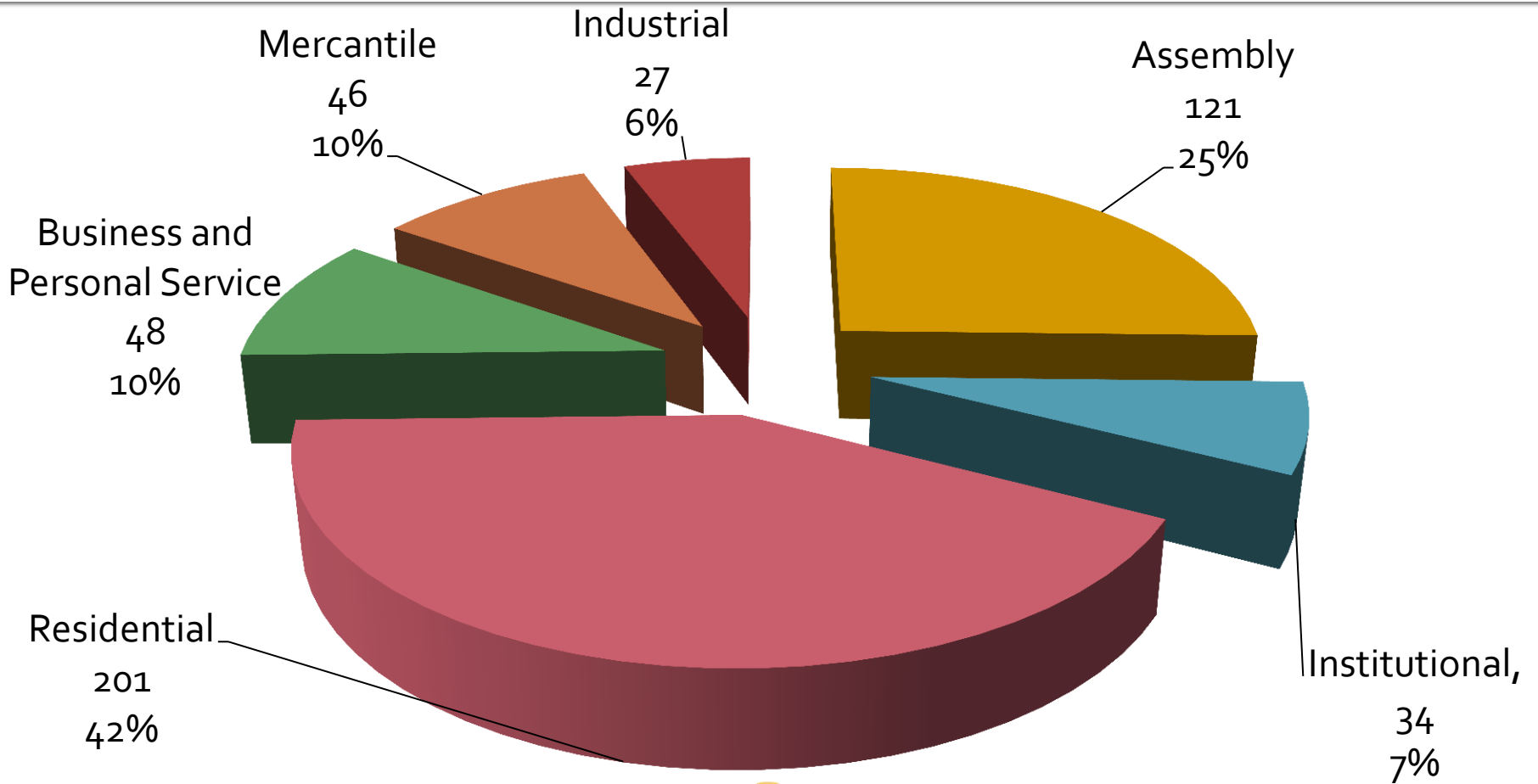
# VULNERABLE OCCUPANCIES

## Nursing Homes and Retirement Homes

- 16 facilities in primary response area
- Fire Prevention staff inspecting each facility
- Conducting actual evacuation drills with residents
- OFM evacuation timelines utilized
- Proposed changes to Fire Code – all care facilities will require sprinkler protection upon approval of legislation

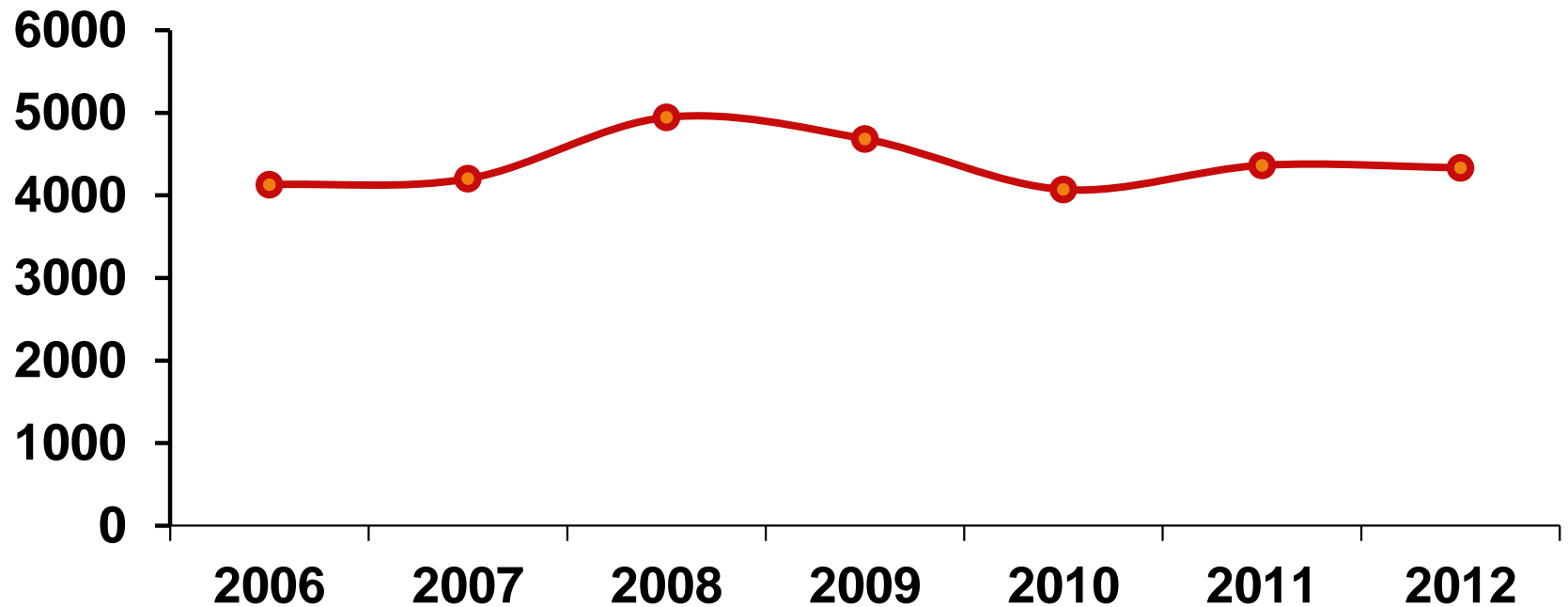

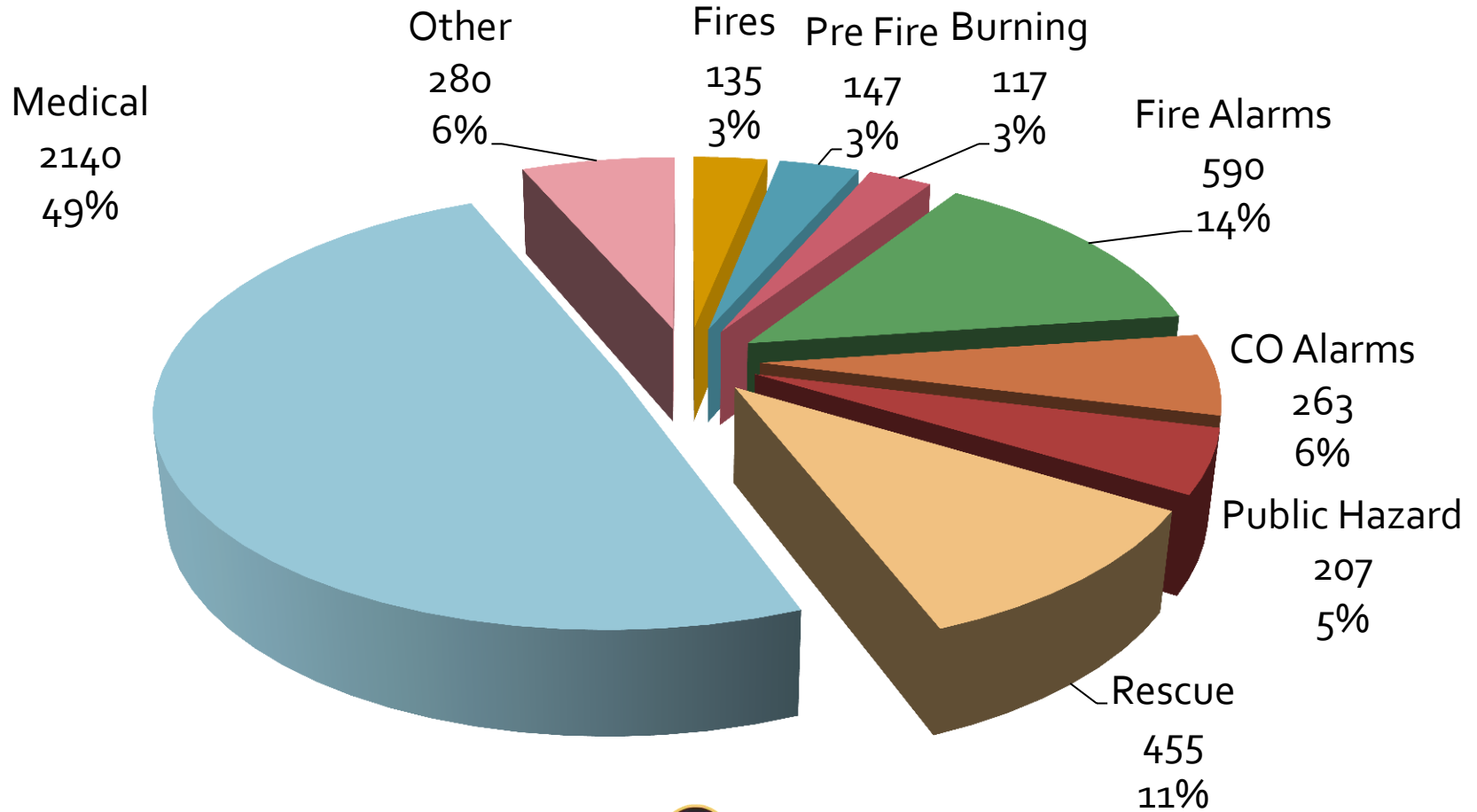


# EMERGENCY RESPONSE DATA

# RESPONSE BENCHMARKS

## CYFS strives to achieve:

Call Processing – within 1 minute or less

Turnout Time – within 1 minute or less

Travel Time – “driving time” within 4 min or less

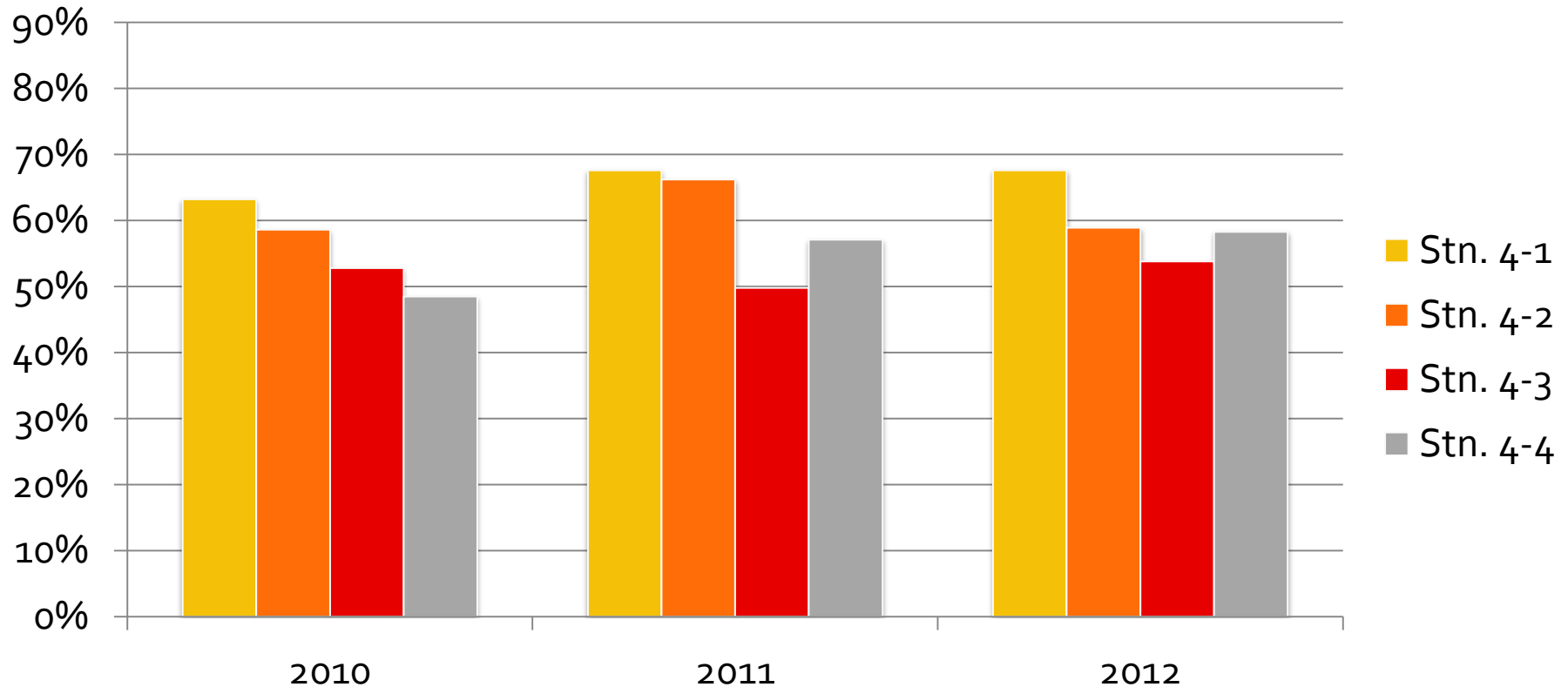
Total Response Time – First truck to arrive within 6 min or less  
90% of the time

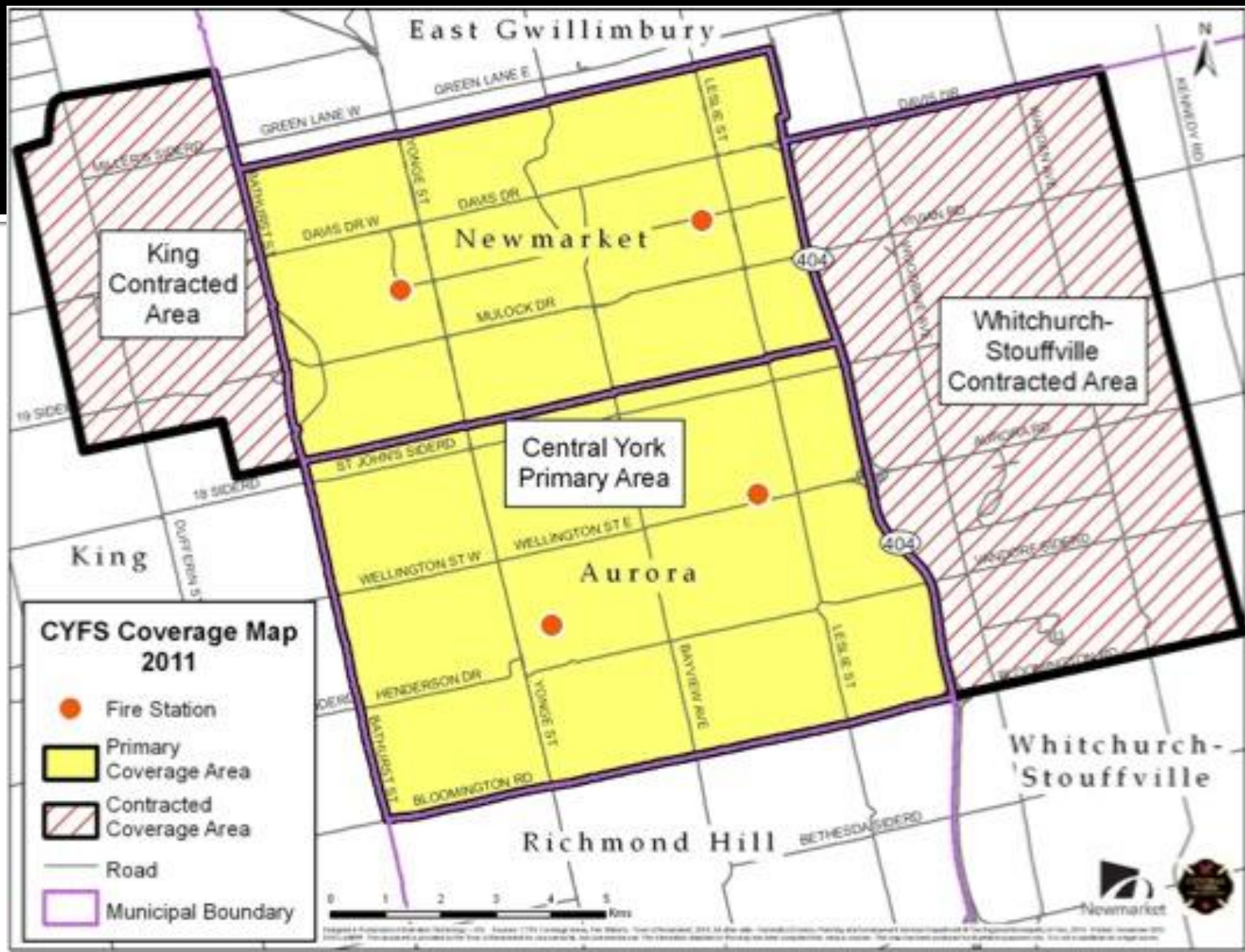
Response to reported structures fire with a minimum of 12  
Firefighters - within 10 min or less 90% of the time
