


#### MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF





## FIRE SERVICE COST




### **OVERTIME ANALYSIS**


### **VUNERABLE OCCUPANCIES**

#### **Nursing Homes and Retirement Homes**

- Conducting actual evacuation drills with residents
- OFM evacuation timelines utilized
- Proposed changes to Fire Code all care facilities will require sprinkler protection upon approval of legislation






## **EMERGENCY RESPONSE DATA**

### RESPONSE BENCHMARKS

#### **CYFS** strives to achieve:

Call Processing – within 1 minute or less

Turnout Time - within 1 minute or less

Travel Time – "driving time" within 4 min or less


Total Response Time – First truck to arrive within 6 min or less 90% of the time


Response to reported structures fire with a minimum of 12 Firefighters - within 10 min or less 90% of the time
