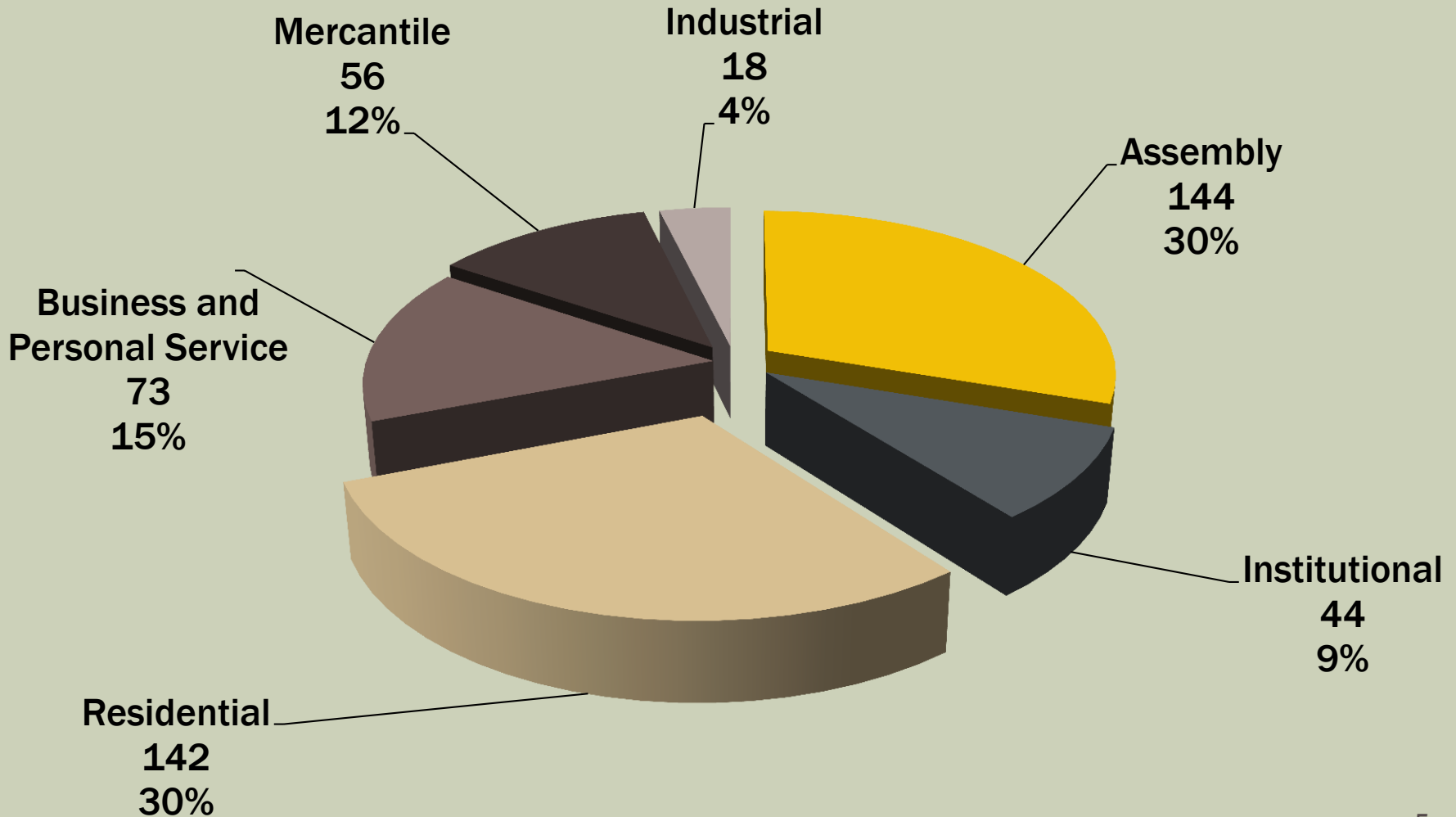
VULNERABLE OCCUPANCIES

- **16 facilities currently have sprinkler protection**

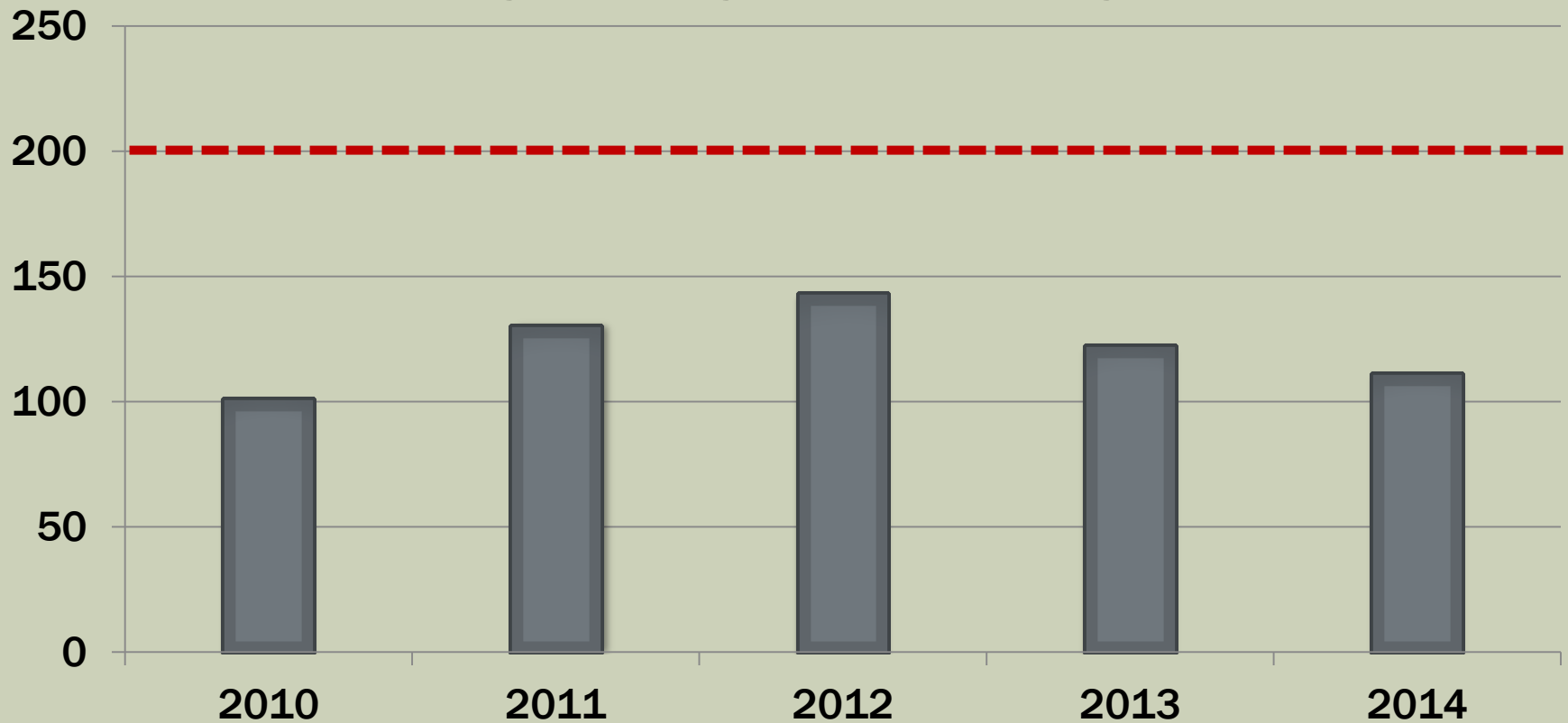
FIRE CODE INSPECTIONS



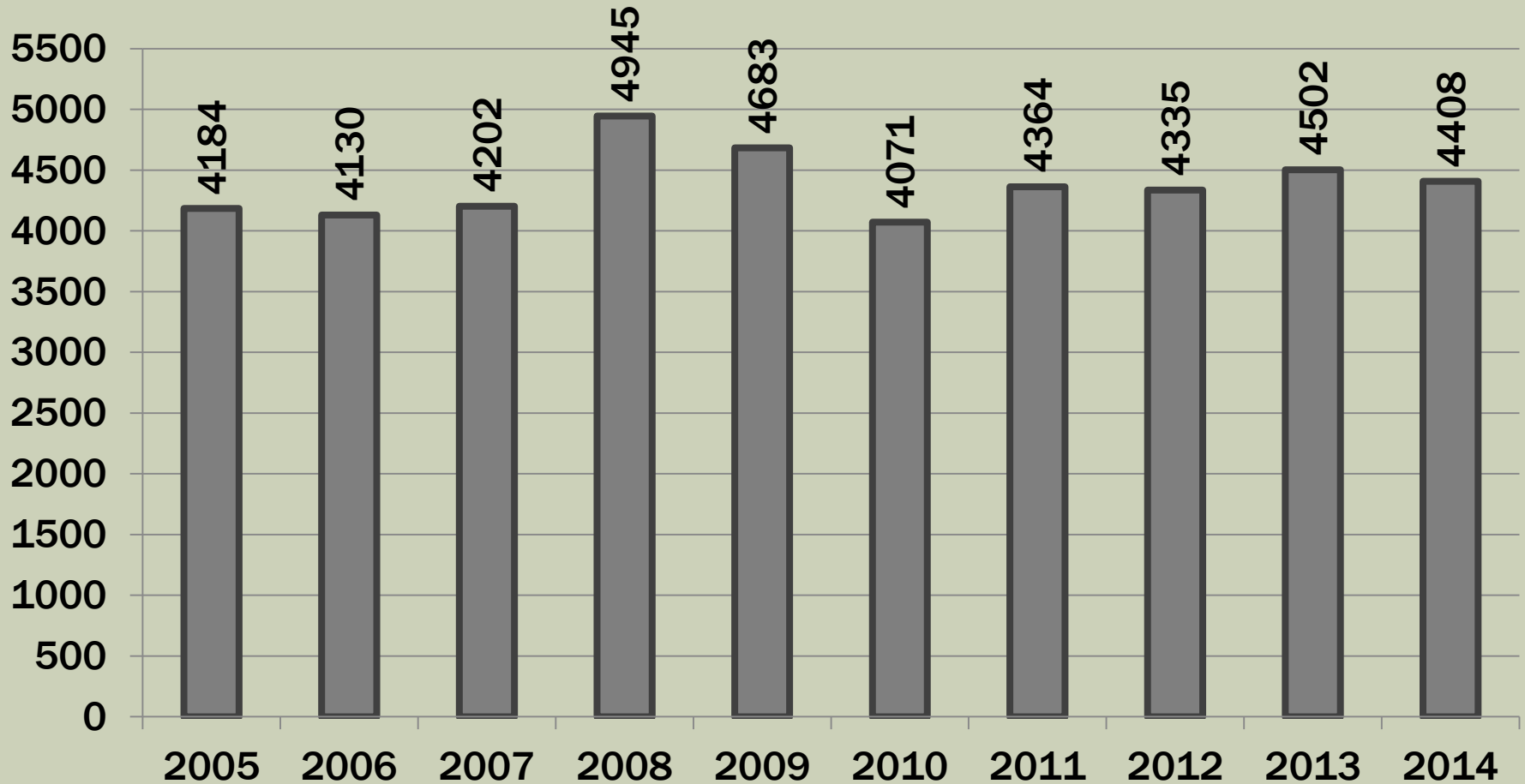
TRAINING DIVISION



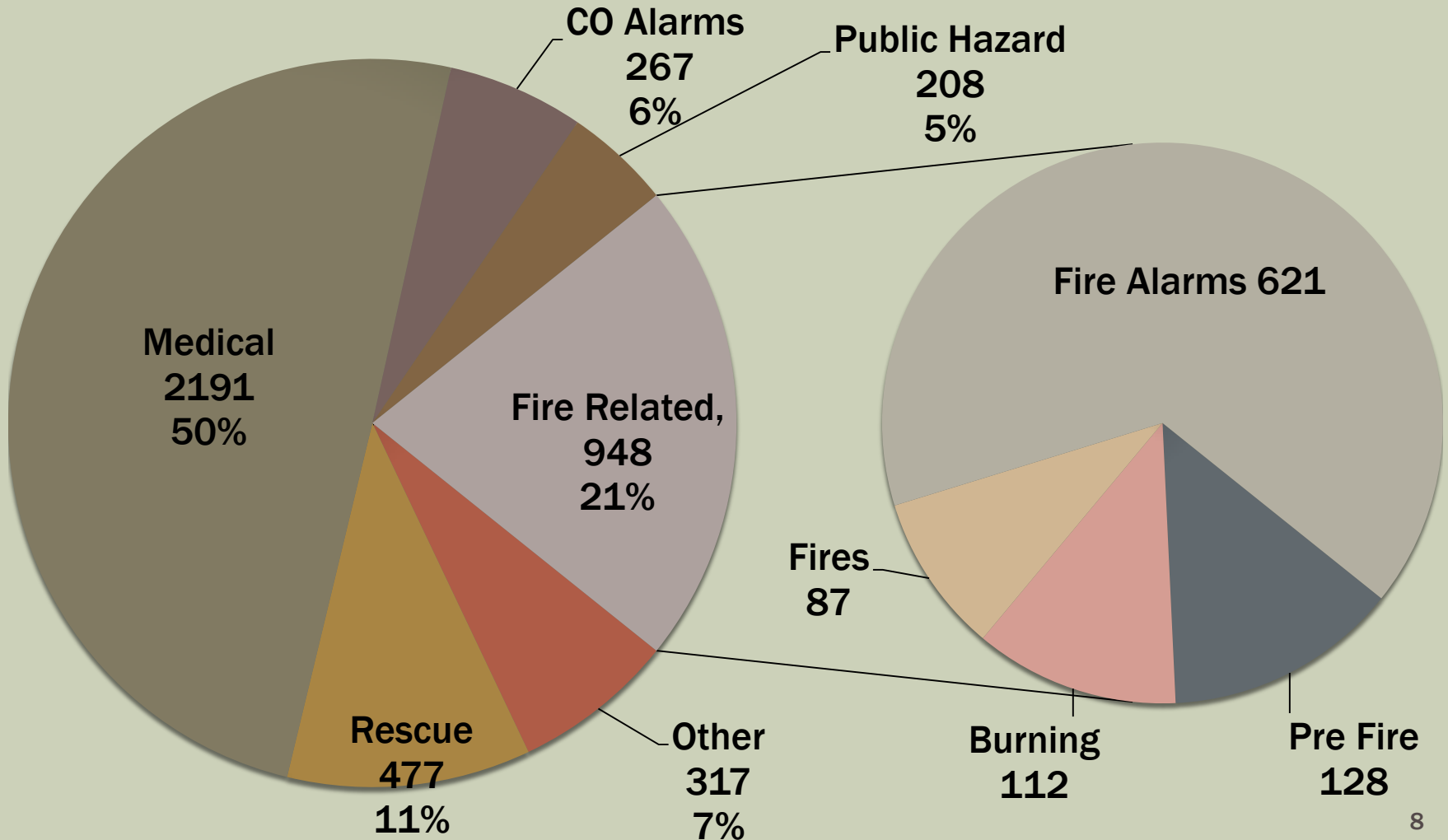
Average Training Hours per Firefighter



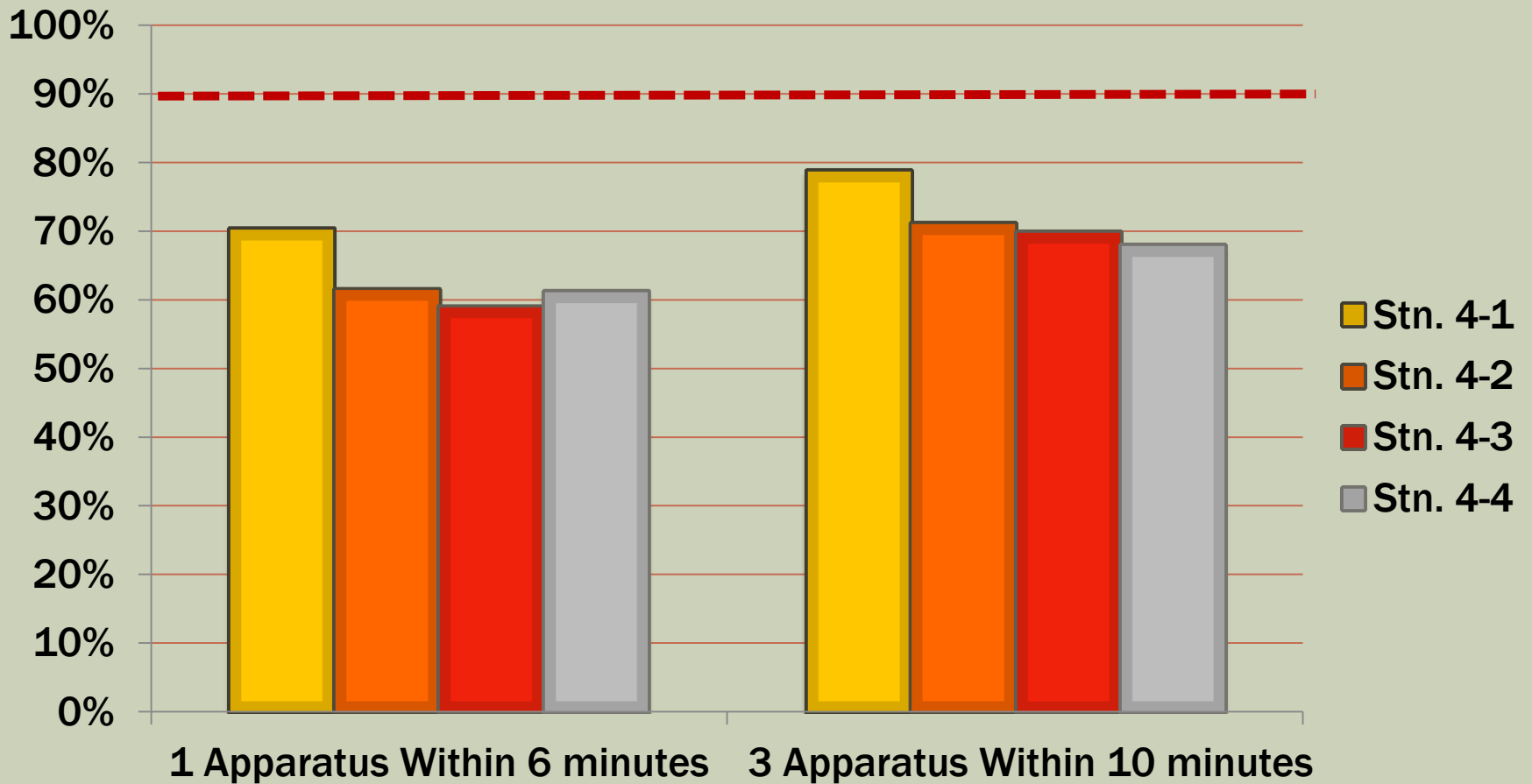
EMERGENCY RESPONSE DATA
